

VEISHEA through the years...

1930s

The Nite Show, "Robin Hood," was VEISHEA's first professionally written play--the show sold out both Friday and Saturday with an encore performance on Sunday

Film crews from Paramount came to film VEISHEA events

Due to the Great Depression, VEISHEA Central Committee sold coupon books for \$3 that included a ticket to the Nite Show, Saturday Night Dance, & a cherry pie

Last May Fête was held and ROTC Sham Battle replaced parade due to low funding

Lake LaVerne was cleaned up and no longer held the nickname "Lake LaMud" Last Moving Up Ceremony was held

Four swans were given as a gift to the college from VEISHEA and were released on Lake LaVerne from the ROTC swan float

The parade consisted of 45 floats and was moved from Friday afternoon to Saturday morning

"Fountain of the Four Seasons" at the Memorial Union was donated by VEISHEA WOI Radio broadcasted the parade

Mary Janet McDonald was crowned the first VEISHEA Queen of Queens

Nite Show was moved outside and renamed Stars Over Veishea
