1980s

The Government of the Student Body moved VEISHEA back into the month of May
VEISHEA earned the right to call itself the largest student-organized event in the nation

VEISHEA flag was made and flew beneath the American flag during VEISHEA weekend

VEISHEA torch tradition revived
• VEISHEA torch was renamed the "Flame of Excellence" which was also the VEISHEA theme that year

Vikings Linebacker and Iowa State alum Matt Blair spoke at VEISHEA
Cherry Pies were purchased for 55 cents each

Johnny Orr lit the VEISHEA torch

5K and 10K Runs were introduced

Jack Trice statue was placed between Beardshear and Carver Halls
Disturbances occurred off-campus
