# Great Attraction Slated for Cyclone Grid Fans

What football fan would like a better attraction than he can get right here on Clyde Williams Field today—The Dirty Thirty against the Hopped-Up 'Huskers!

Today's game will match the most colorful major football team in the nation against the perpetrator of the Big Eight's top upset. Iowa State and Nebraska—a real show any time and today certain to be a great one.

From coast to coast the Cyclones have become known affectionately as the Dirty Thirty following a pair of grimy victories on muddy gridirons at Drake and Denver. Students and fans alike have taken the gutty band of hard-nosed gridders as their special "pets". The "Go, Dirty Thirty" chant has become known wherever football is being played in America.

But famous as the Dirty Thirty is it has to share the spot light today with another famous unit—the Cornhuskers of Nebraska. Given absolutely no chance at all against Oklahoma last week, Nebraska did what no conference team has done in 13 years—defeated the Sooners, 25-21. And they did it the hard way, losing the lead and then fighting back to squelch the defending champions.

Both teams have much the same attitude toward the game—it is a game for men of courage, for men in top physical condition, for hard-nosed athletes. A "hard-nose" is a guy who is not afraid to stick his nose into trouble. Certainly neither the

Dirty Thirty nor the Cornhuskers lack that type of courage.

Right now is a good time to pay tribute to another part of the Dirty Thirty team—the freshman squad. The yearlings have sacrificed all chance for winning football games this fall in order to help the Dirty Thirty. This is a fine squad, despite two losses to Nebraska and Missouri. It is already fired up with the spirit of the Dirty Thirty and is itching to get into the act "for real" next fall. Without the work against the freshmen the Dirty Thirty could never have had the fine season it is having.

It is no wonder that the varsity, too, is eagerly awaiting the time when this bunch of fast and husky youngsters moves up to join forces with them. That, Mr., Mrs., and Miss Cyclone fan, is going to be quite a team.

That, however, is next year—right now the assignment is Nebraska.

This is another "big" assignment for the Dirty Thirty. Nebraska is big in achievement and big in physical stature, averaging 202 in the line and 182 in the backfield for a team mean of 195. The same figures for the Cyclones are 185, 169, 179.

But big assignments have been the regular "menu" for the Dirty Thirty. So ALL of us—coaches, players, and fans—have a big job today. We know the Dirty Thirty will give 60 full minutes of action. We'd better be ready to do the same.



#### PENALTIES

- OFFSIDE by either team; violation of scrimmage or free kick formation; encroachment of neutral zone—Loss of Five Yards.
- 2. ILLEGAL PROCEDURE, POSITION OR SUB-STITUTION — Putting ball in play before referee signals "ready-for-play"; failure to complete substitution before play starts; player out of bounds when scrimmage begins; failure to maintain proper alignment of offensive team when ball is snapped; false or simulating start of a play; taking more than two steps after fair catch is made; player on line receiving snap — Loss of Five Yards.
- ILLEGAL MOTION—Offensive player illegally in motion when ball is snapped — Loss of Five Yards.
- ILLEGAL SHIFT—Failure to stop one full second following shift—Loss of 15 Yards.
- 5. ILLEGAL RETURN of substitute not previously disqualified—Loss of 15 Yards.
- 6. ILLEGAL DELAY OF GAME; Taking more than four times out during either half (except for replacement of injured player)— Loss of Five Yards. Team not ready to play at start of either half—Loss of 15 Yards.
- 7. PERSONAL FOUL—Tackling or blocking defensive player who has made fair catch; piling on; hurdling; grasping face mask of opponent; tackling player out of bounds, or running into player obviously out of play; striking an opponent with fist, forearm, elbow or locked hands; kicking or kneeing—Loss of 15 Yards. (Flagrant offenders will be disqualified.)
- 8. CLIPPING-Loss of 15 Yards.
- ROUGHING THE KICKER or holder—Loss of 15 Yards.

- 10. UNSPORTSMANLIKE CONDUCT—Violation of rules during intermission; illegal return of suspended player; coaching from side-lines; invalid signal for fair catch; persons illegally on field—Loss of 15 Yards. (Flagrant offenders will be disqualified.)
- ILLEGAL USE OF HANDS AND ARMS by offensive or defensive player; defensive holding—Loss of 15 Yards.
- INTENTIONAL GROUNDING of forward pass—Loss of Five Yards from Spot of Pass, Plus Loss of Down.
- ILLEGALLY PASSING OR HANDING BALL FORWARD—Loss of Five Yards, Plus Loss of Down.
- 14. FORWARD PASS OR KICK CATCHING INTERFERENCE — Interference with opportunity of player of receiving team to catch a kick—Loss of 15 Yards. Interference by members of offensive team with defensive player making pass interception—Loss of 15 Yards, Plus Loss of Down. Interference by defensive team on forward pass—Passing Team's Ball at Spot of Foul, and First Down.
- 15. INELIGIBLE RECEIVER DOWNFIELD ON PASS—Loss of 15 Yards.
- 16. BALL ILLEGALLY TOUCHED, KICKED OR BATTED—Forward pass being touched by ineligible receiver beyond the line of scrimmage—Loss of 15 Yards from Spot of Preceding Down, and Loss of a Down. Eligible pass receiver going out of bounds and later touching a forward pass—Loss of Down. Illegal touching of kicked ball within opponent's ten-yard line—Touchback.
- 17. PENALTY DECLINED—Incomplete forward pass; no play or no score.
- 18. CRAWLING by runner—Loss of Five Yards.
  Interlocked interference Loss of 15 Yards.
